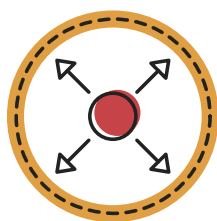


# Guiding principles for setting the remit of a climate assembly



## **Context**

The remit fits the context of climate politics.



## **Scope**

Sufficient time to develop recommendations, understand consequences, and provide justifications.



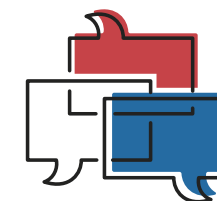
## **Authority**

The sponsoring authority has sufficient power to act on recommendations.



## **Political relevance**

Policymakers see a need for change on the issue.



## **Receptiveness**

Policymakers welcome citizen input on the issue.



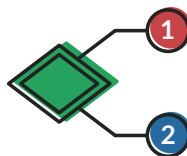
## **Societal relevance**

The issue is important to citizens.



## **Timing**

An opportunity to affect change exists.



## **Dilemmas**

Clear trade-offs should be made.



## **Legitimacy**

The remit is seen as legitimate by most groups.



## **Ownership**

Citizens are not unjustly constrained by the remit.



## **Resource efficiency**

Societal benefits outweigh invested resources.
