





- **Lack of systematic and comprehensive records of citizens.**
- **Increased willingness to participate by formally educated citizens** + already interested in politics (Walsh and Elkink 2021).
- **Limited motivation to participate by most affected communities** (Phadke et al 2015).
- **Gendered and racial barriers to participation** such as care work and time inequalities (see e.g. Young 2000).

- 4) Political **agency**

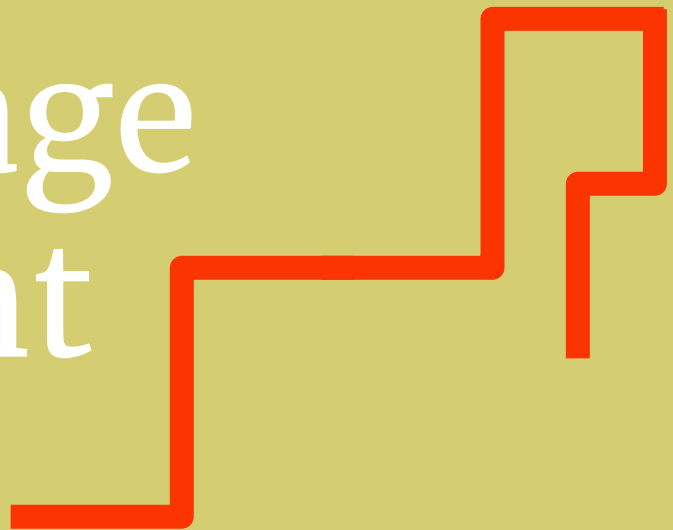
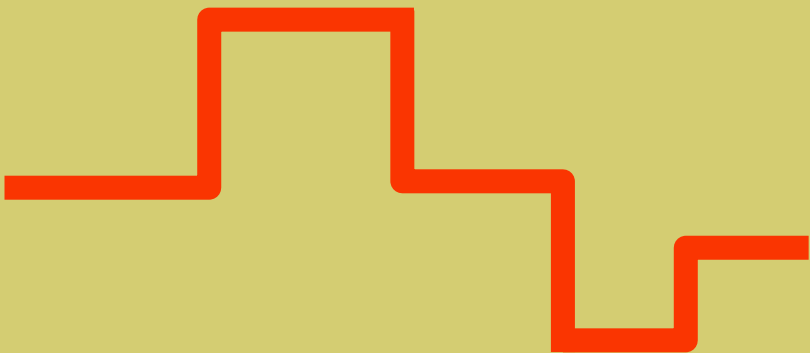

Political Agency	Unproblematized

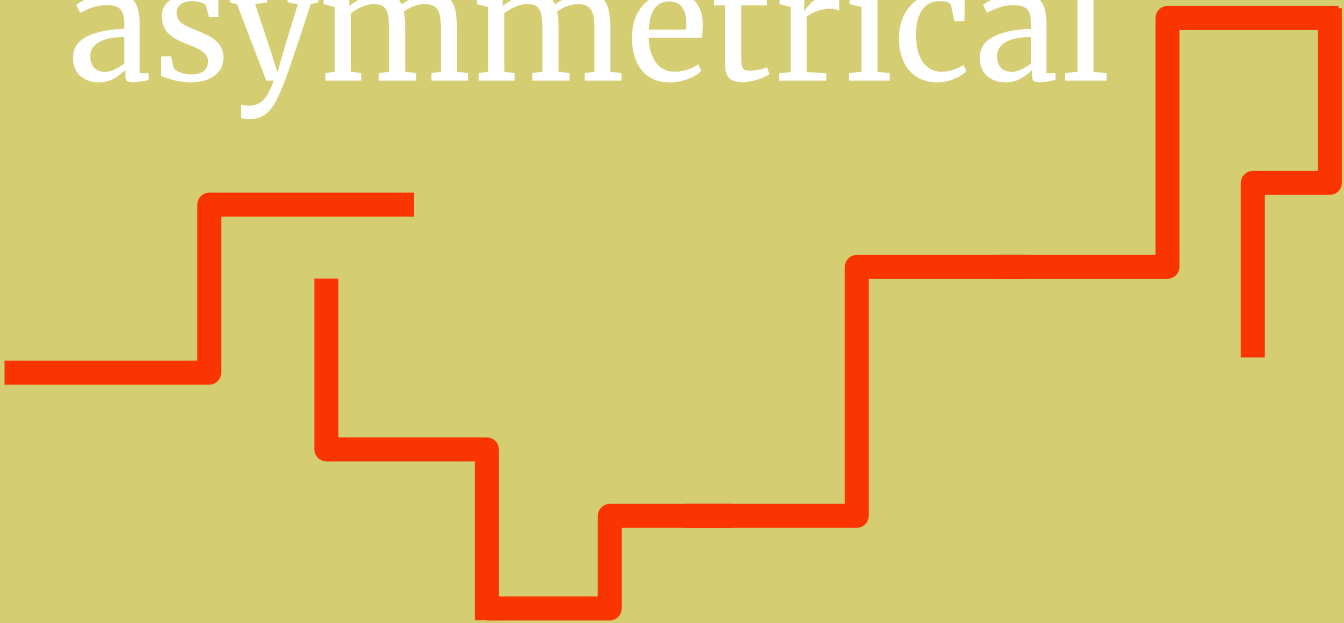
1 disadvantage as intersectional



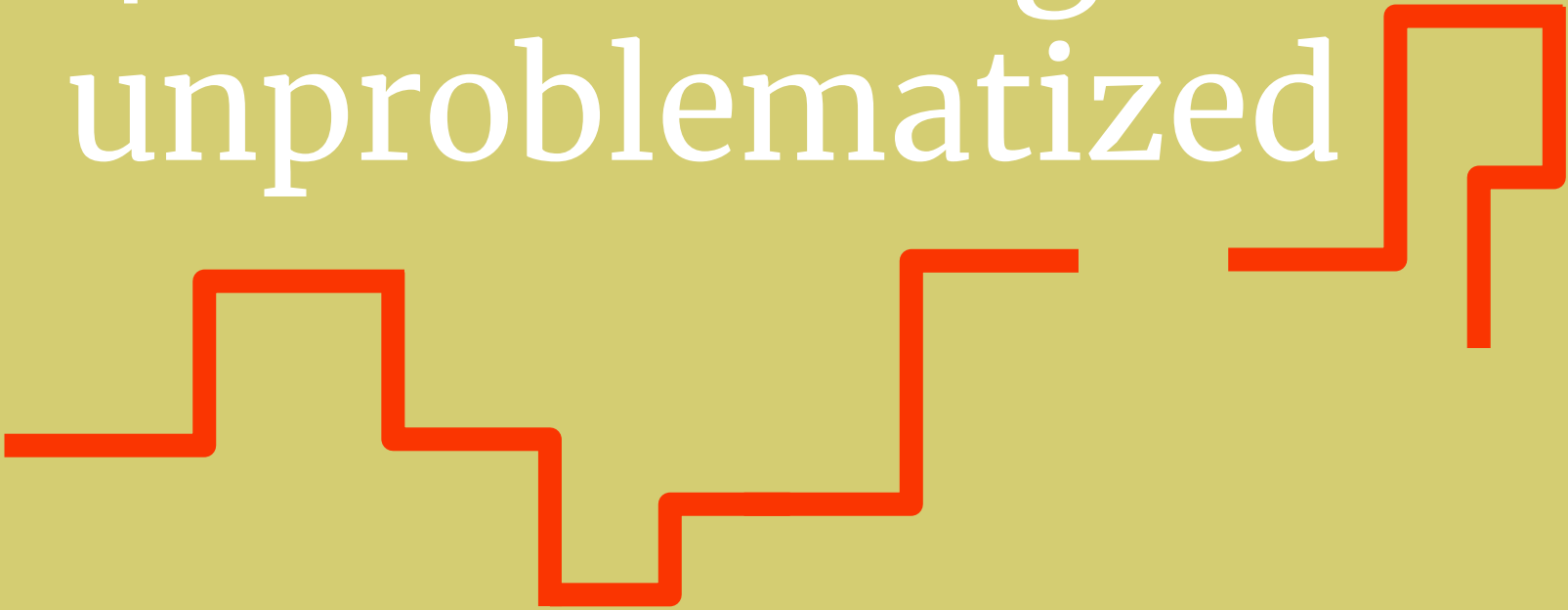
2 disadvantage
